Even if the temperature outside is only 70°, the inside of your car may be as much as 20 degrees hotter.

- Young, elderly, overweight, short-muzzled pets and pets with thick or dark-colored coats are most at risk for overheating.
- A vehicle may overheat even with windows left open an inch or two.
- Shade moves with the sun and provides little protection on a hot day.
- It is prohibited by law in many areas to leave pets unattended in a vehicle under unsafe condi tions, including a hot day.
