

# YOUR KITTEN'S FIRST YEAR



## VACCINATIONS

Your kitten will need various vaccinations during its first few months.

- The FVRCP vaccine should be given every 3-4 weeks until 16 weeks of age
- The feline leukemia vaccine should be given twice: the first vaccine is given and then 3-4 weeks later a booster is given.
- Your kitten should be at least 16 weeks of age to receive its first rabies vaccine.

## OTHER HEALTH SERVICES TO CONSIDER

- A fecal sample should be tested for intestinal parasites
  - If parasites are found, medication will be prescribed and then an additional fecal sample should be tested 3-4 weeks later
- Flea control is strongly recommended for your kitten.

## SPAY OR NEUTER

- Plan for this at or after 6 months of age

## PET INSURANCE

- If you are interested in pet insurance, now is the time when your cat is young and healthy, as healthy kittens have no restrictions to their policy. Plan to get coverage as soon as possible.

- Know where your local 24-hour emergency hospital is located before you need it. We can advise you about ER vet hospitals in the area.
